History and Mystery of Brownsea



English:

The children will be trying their hand at two different text types based on the history and mystery of Brownsea Island. They will write their own suspense story, looking in detail at how to build suspense. They will also create their own non-chronological report about this wonderful local landmark.

Maths:

The children will begin learning about multiplication and division before moving on to developing their understanding of fractions and decimals. There will continue to be a big push on ensuring that the children are secure in their times tables knowledge so please keep the practice up at home too! The children are doing brilliantly so far!

<u>P.E:</u> The children will be improving their gym skills during indoor lessons and trying their hand at golf skills outdoors.

<u>Computing:</u> The children will be learning all about creating digital artwork.

<u>Religion and World Views:</u> This half term the children will be learning about Islam, particularly mosques and Hajj.

<u>French:</u> The children will be learning how to say different colours and ask questions.

<u>Music</u>: The children will be improvising and composing their own musical pieces.

DT:

The children will be using their design skills to design and make their own bug hotel.

Reading:

This half term, the children will continue to develop their skills in fact retrieval, inference and word meaning. Our class reader this half term will be 'Why the Whales Came' by Michael Morpurgo.

Science and Geography:

In Science, the children will learn about living things and their habitats with a particular focus on local wildlife. They will learn how to classify animals.

In geography, the children will learn about Brownsea and the local area, focussing on its geography using map work.

PSHE: Dreams and Goals

The children will understand that it is important to have hopes and dreams. Additionally, they will learn about the importance of resilience and how to draw upon positive and happy times to help them overcome disappointments, then how to set new plans to achieve a new goal.
