Geography

In 1914, Ernest Shackleton made his third trip to the Antarctic with his ship, Endurance, planning to cross Antarctica via the South Pole.

We will be kick starting this topic with a survival day on Tuesday 20th February so the children can get a taste of what Shackleton and his men experienced.

In Geography lessons, the children will be locating areas of the globe such as the Arctic and Antarctic circles. They will be exploring different climate zones on our planet.



Science

The children will learn to recognise the differences between solids, liquids and gases, as well as thinking about what temperature is and how it can change the state of a material.

<u>English</u>

Our first writing topic this half term will centre around Survival Day. The children will write a detailed recount of their experience, describing all the new survival tactics they have learnt.
