Year 6 Topic Newsletter

In D&T (Design and Technology), the children will construct a moving buggy out of wood, using accurate measuring and cutting with a saw. The buggy will consist of a chassis (main body), axels (to attach the wheels) and they will need to attach a motor that will make the vehicle move.

Science

The children are going to be building on their Year 4 learning on electricity and investigating what affects the brightness of a circuit.

English

We are continuing to write for a variety of different purposes and audiences this term. We will be using visual literacy, such as a suspense story based on an animation called 'Alma', as well as other pieces of writing based on a haunted house and an assassin. Following this, the children will be creating an information leaflet based on an attraction they have visited or a 'dream holiday' destination.

In our reading lessons, we will be continuing to consolidate the main curriculum objectives of information retrieval, word meaning and inference using our new book, 'Wonder,' written by R.J. Palacio. This book focuses on the life of 10-year-old 'Áuggie', who was born with a facial abnormality and has been home-schooled all his life. Now, for the first time, he is going to school, which he is dreading. The book provides opportunities for lots of discussions about feelings, other people's perceptions and the impact that can have on a child.
