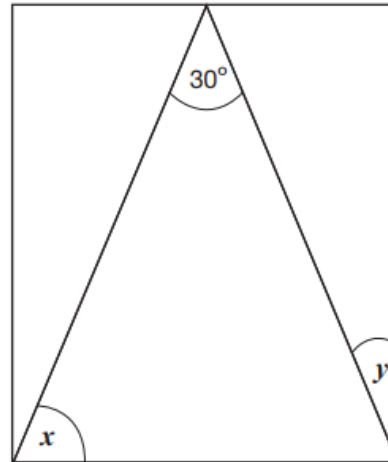

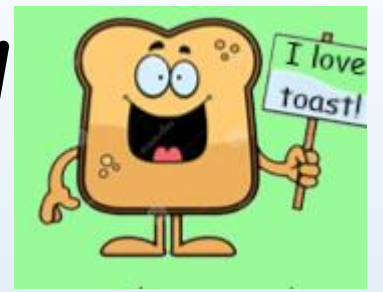
SATs Week timetable

- In order to relax the children during SATs week itself, we are offering a free toast club for every Year 6 child from 8am on Monday-Thursday.

Test format - SPaG

The SPaG test comprises of 2 tests.

- Paper 1: Grammar and punctuation short answer questions - 45 minutes with a maximum of 50 marks.
- Paper 2 - spelling test - 15 minutes long with a maximum of 20 marks.

What is being assessed in grammar, punctuation and spelling - otherwise known as SPaG

- - Grammatical terms/word classes
- - Function of sentences
- - Combining words, phrases and clauses
- - Verb form, tense and consistency
- - Punctuation
- - Vocabulary
- - Standard English and formality

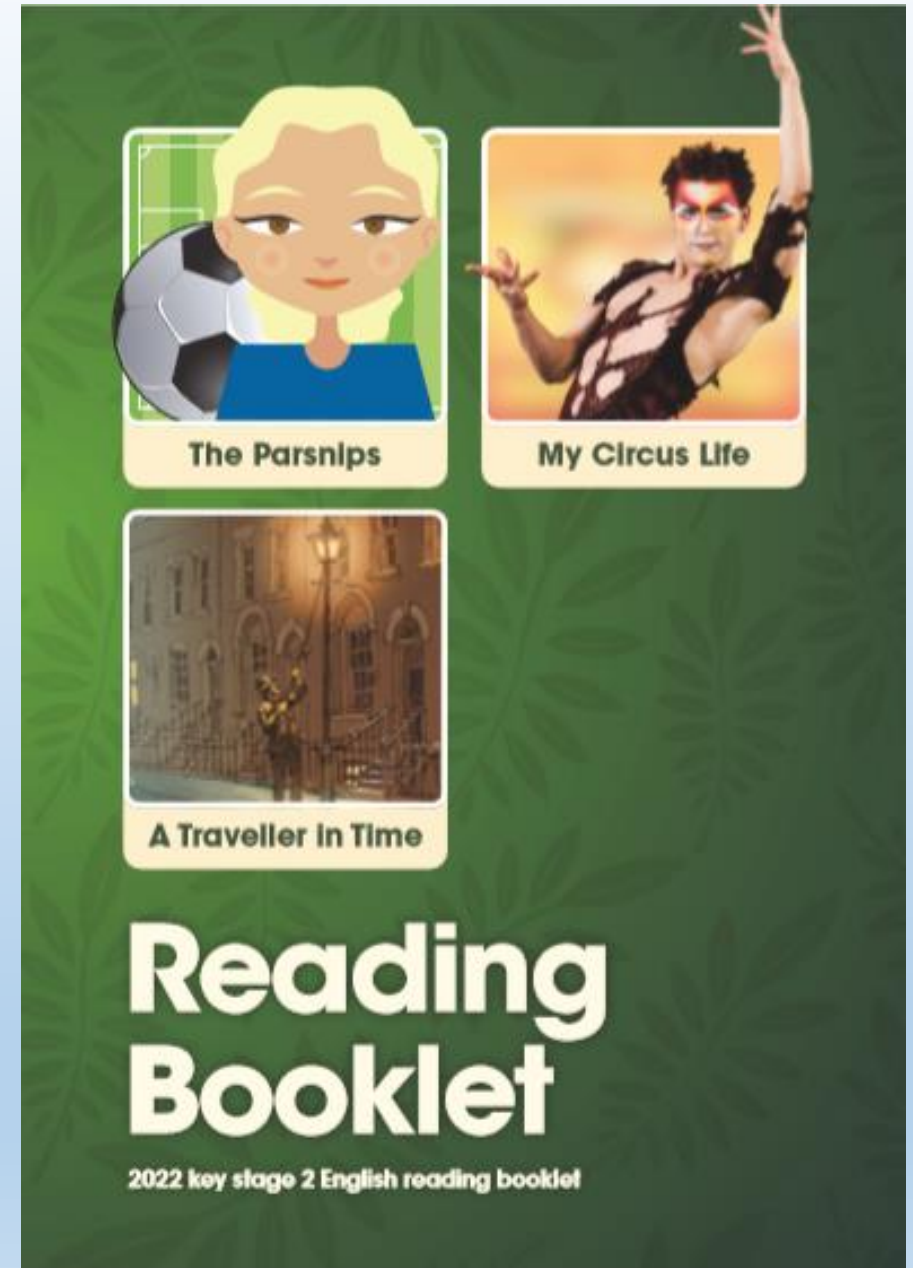



Test format - Maths

The Maths test comprises of 3 tests.

- Paper 1: Arithmetic - 30 minutes - 40 marks
- Paper 2: Reasoning - 40 minutes - 35 marks

Thursday:

- Paper 3: Reasoning - 40 minutes - 35 marks

What is being assessed in Maths?

- - Number and place value, approximation and estimation/rounding
- - Four rules of calculation
- - Fractions, decimals and percentages
- - Ratio and proportion
- - Algebra
- - Measurement
- - Geometry: properties of shape
- - Geometry: position and direction
- - Statistics

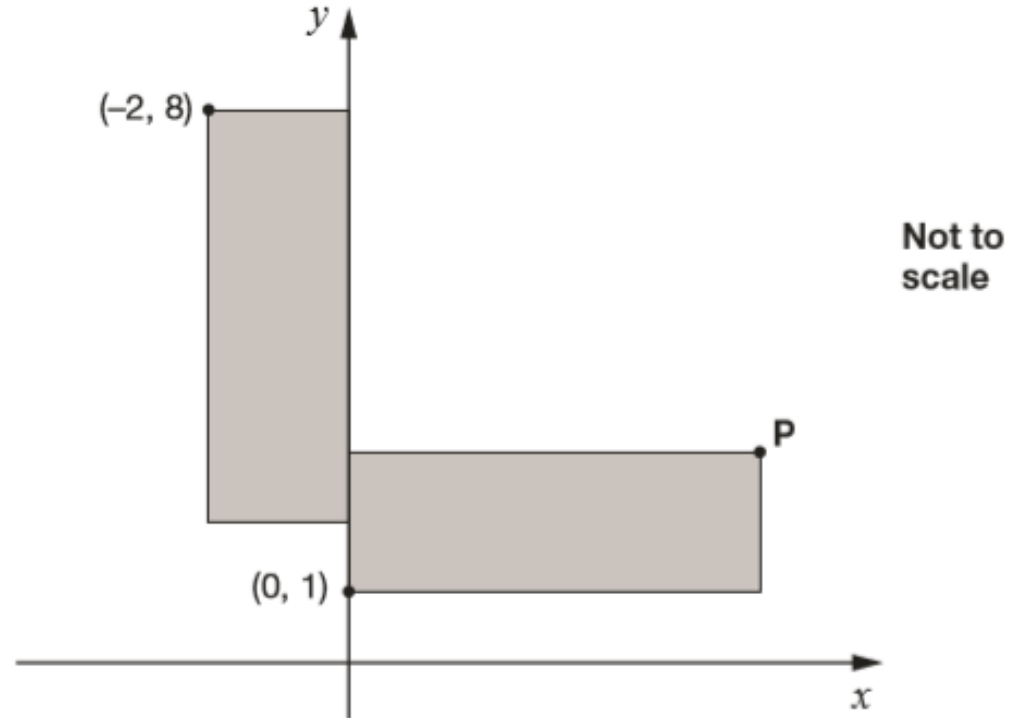

All tests are marked externally.

- The total marks will be converted into a scaled score.
- To achieve the expected standard (EXS) in Year 6, children need a scaled score of 100 or above.

Writing:

- There is no formal test for writing. The children's writing is assessed throughout their time in Year 6. There is a moderation process for writing and the work from now until May will be what is judged.

The children and teachers, will sleep comfortably in bell tents and all meals will be cooked over a campfire which the children can help us prepare. Everyone has the opportunity to enjoy hot chocolate, toasted marshmallows and a few songs around the fire to round off each day.

Dear Parent/Carer

Your child is to be included in the off-site educational visit to Fresh Air Club from 16th to 17th June 2025.

In order for the trip to run smoothly, and all pupils enjoy it, they need to be clear about the expectations. Therefore, we would ask you to read the following with your child, before both agreeing to follow the guidelines. If there is anything you would like to discuss before signing, please contact us.

Pupils will:

- Respond to all staff in the same manner as to their school staff.
- Respect one another and treat others as they would hope to be treated.
- Attempt to take part in all of the activities, unless there is a medical reason to prevent them from doing so.
- Follow all rules as explained before the visit and on arrival.
- Respect all property and equipment.
- Be responsible for their own property, including the return of that property.

Pupils will not:

- Enter the tents of pupils of the opposite sex.
- Disturb others or prevent them from getting to sleep after lights out at 10pm.
- Use any equipment or try any activity without the supervision of staff.
- Attempt to leave the site at any time.
- Take any electrical devices such as: mobile phones, AirPods or cameras, etc. on the visit.

(Please note that any valuables that are taken, will be the student's sole responsibility).

Although this is all 'common sense' behaviour, when written down these restrictions may sound like strict laws. If a child breaches the agreed conduct, you will be contacted and the necessary measures will be advised. In the most serious cases, you would need to collect your child from the site.

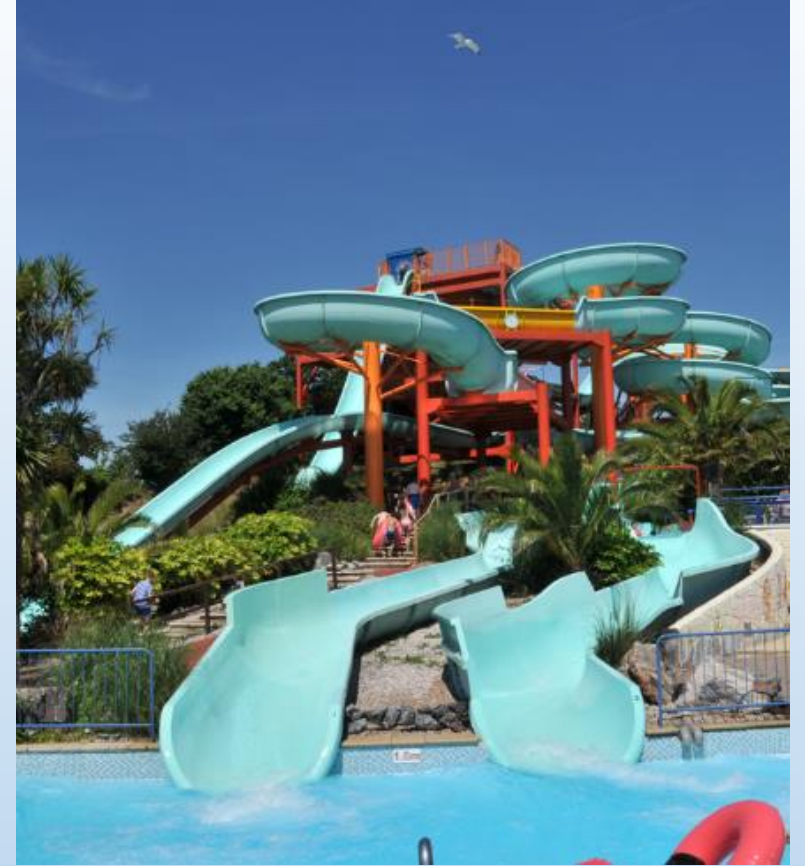

Important information:

Important message parents of children entitled to Free school meals. Frequently asked questions

Who will be in my child's tent?

The children have completed a questionnaire with the names of 5 pupils they would like in their tent. We will aim to ensure that at least one of those named are in their tent. This is a difficult job and not always possible.

My child is a fussy eater. How will you ensure they eat?

Children are usually more experimental with food when around their peers. If you are worried, pack them some snacks.

Frequently asked questions

Will you make my child go on certain rides/activities?

No - we will actively encourage children to "have a go" and step out of their comfort zone. We will try our best to group children based on their thrill seeking attitude.
