Dear Parents and Carers,

You may have noticed the whole school has been really busy recently and there is a lovely festive atmosphere. We have all enjoyed some lovely Christmas events. Pastoral Care aims to help every child feel settled, secure and happy as they progress through the school and to ensure they receive the right kind of support to help with their individual and specific needs. We offer a variety of in-school interventions for the children and can also signpost parents and carers to further support such as the School Nurse, Family Support Workers and Mental Health Organisations.

In addition, we now have a BCP School Navigator who comes into school every 4-5 weeks. Navigators can provide parents with personalised support on a wide range of subjects. These include parenting programmes, behaviour support, general wellbeing, attachment and anxiety. Please let me know if you would like further information and to book an appointment.

Other support with the Cost of Living situation

As the cost of living increases it is important to be aware of the benefits, payments and support options available to you. There are local and national schemes that can help you with rent, food, energy and more. In addition there is a range of local support which is available which is detailed below.

Household Support Fund 3

This funding is to support residents in BCP with the cost of living situations around keeping warm, reducing energy bills and accessing food across the winter.

Age.








We have been getting our musical hats on this term, learning to play the jumbie pans and the glockenspiels!




















We had a visit from Matt the Vicar to explain the meaning of Christingles, as well as a visitor share their knowledge of being Jewish.
